John 2:1-11

- 1 AND the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there:  
2 And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.  
3 And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus saith unto him, They have no wine.  
4 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine hour is not yet come.  
5 His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do *it*.  
6 And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece.  
7 Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim.  
8 And he saith unto them, Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare *it*.  
9 When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom,  
10 And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: *but* thou hast kept the good wine until now.  
11 This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.

Matt 8:1-16

- 1 WHEN he was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed him.  
2 And, behold, there came a leper and worshipped him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean.  
3 And Jesus put forth *his* hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed.  
4 And Jesus saith unto him, See thou tell no man; but go thy way, shew thyself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them.

- ¶ And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a  
5 centurion, beseeching him,  
6 And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously  
tormented.  
7 And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him.  
8 The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou  
shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant  
shall be healed.  
9 For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this  
*man*, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my  
servant, Do this, and he doeth *it*.  
10 When Jesus heard *it*, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I  
say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel.  
11 And I say unto you, That many shall come from the east and west, and  
shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of  
heaven.  
12 But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there  
shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.  
13 And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed,  
*so* be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour.  
14 ¶ And when Jesus was come into Peter's house, he saw his wife's mother  
laid, and sick of a fever.  
15 And he touched her hand, and the fever left her: and she arose, and  
ministered unto them.  
16 ¶ When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were  
possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with *his* word, and healed  
all that were sick:

Luke 4:30 (to he), 31-36 came

- 30 But he  
31 came down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and taught them on the  
sabbath days.  
32 And they were astonished at his doctrine: for his word was with power.  
33 ¶ And in the synagogue there was a man, which had a spirit of an unclean  
devil, and cried out with a loud voice,  
34 Saying, Let *us* alone; what have we to do with thee, *thou* Jesus of  
Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art; the Holy  
One of God.  
35 And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him.  
And when the devil had thrown him in the midst, he came out of him, and  
hurt him not.  
36 And they were all amazed, and spake among themselves, saying, What a  
word *is* this! for with authority and power he commandeth the unclean  
spirits, and they come out.

### Mark 2:1, 3-12

- 1 AND again he entered into Capernaum after *some* days; and it was noised that he was in the house.
- 3 And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four.
- 4 And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken *it* up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay.
- 5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee.
- 6 But there were certain of the scribes sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts,
- 7 Why doth this *man* thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only?
- 8 And immediately when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, Why reason ye these things in your hearts?
- 9 Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, *Thy* sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk?
- 10 But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,)
- 11 I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy bed, and go thy way into thine house.
- 12 And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion.

### Luke 7:11-16

- 11 ¶ And it came to pass the day after, that he went into a city called Nain; and many of his disciples went with him, and much people.
- 12 Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her.
- 13 And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her, and said unto her, Weep not.
- 14 And he came and touched the bier: and they that bare *him* stood still. And he said, Young man, I say unto thee, Arise.
- 15 And he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And he delivered him to his mother.
- 16 And there came a fear on all: and they glorified God, saying, That a great prophet is risen up among us; and, That God hath visited his people.

### Luke 8:26-39

- 26 ¶ And they arrived at the country of the Gadarenes, which is over against Galilee.
- 27 And when he went forth to land, there met him out of the city a certain man, which had devils long time, and ware no clothes, neither abode in *any* house, but in the tombs.

28 When he saw Jesus, he cried out, and fell down before him, and with a  
loud voice said, What have I to do with thee, Jesus, *thou* Son of God most  
high? I beseech thee, torment me not.

29 (For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For  
oftentimes it had caught him: and he was kept bound with chains and in  
fetters; and he brake the bands, and was driven of the devil into the  
wilderness.)

30 And Jesus asked him, saying, What is thy name? And he said, Legion:  
because many devils were entered into him.

31 And they besought him that he would not command them to go out into  
the deep.

32 And there was there an herd of many swine feeding on the mountain: and  
they besought him that he would suffer them to enter into them. And he  
suffered them.

33 Then went the devils out of the man, and entered into the swine: and the  
herd ran violently down a steep place into the lake, and were choked.

34 When they that fed *them* saw what was done, they fled, and went and told  
*it* in the city and in the country.

35 Then they went out to see what was done; and came to Jesus, and found  
the man, out of whom the devils were departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus,  
clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid.

36 They also which saw *it* told them by what means he that was possessed of  
the devils was healed.

37 ¶ Then the whole multitude of the country of the Gadarenes round about  
besought him to depart from them; for they were taken with great fear: and  
he went up into the ship, and returned back again.

38 Now the man out of whom the devils were departed besought him that he  
might be with him: but Jesus sent him away, saying,

39 Return to thine own house, and shew how great things God hath done unto  
thee. And he went his way, and published throughout the whole city how  
great things Jesus had done unto him.

John 11:14, 15, 19-28, 39-44

14 Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead.

15 And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, to the intent ye may  
believe; nevertheless let us go unto him.

19 And many of the Jews came to Martha and Mary, to comfort them  
concerning their brother.

20 Then Martha, as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met  
him: but Mary sat *still* in the house.

21 Then said Martha unto Jesus, Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother  
had not died.

22 But I know, that even now, whatsoever thou wilt ask of God, God will  
give *it* thee.

- 23 Jesus saith unto her, Thy brother shall rise again.
- 24 Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day.
- 25 Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:
- 26 And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?
- 27 She saith unto him, Yea, Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, which should come into the world.
- 28 And when she had so said, she went her way, and called Mary her sister secretly, saying, The Master is come, and calleth for thee.
- 39 Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been *dead* four days.
- 40 Jesus saith unto her, Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God?
- 41 Then they took away the stone *from the place* where the dead was laid. And Jesus lifted up *his* eyes, and said, Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me.
- 42 And I knew that thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said *it*, that they may believe that thou hast sent me.

18 stored health in cases of both acute and chronic disease in  
their severest forms. Secretions have been changed, the  
structure has been renewed, shortened limbs have been  
21 elongated, ankylosed joints have been made supple, and  
carious bones have been restored to healthy conditions. I  
have restored what is called the lost substance of lungs, and  
24 healthy organizations have been established where disease  
was organic. Christian Science heals organic disease as  
surely as it heals what is called functional, for it requires  
27 only a fuller understanding of the divine Principle of

#### SH 192:32-194:5

I was called to visit Mr. Clark in Lynn, who had been  
193:1 confined to his bed six months with hip-disease, caused by  
a fall upon a wooden spike when quite a boy. On enter-  
3 ing the house I met his physician, who said that  
the patient was dying. The physician had just  
probed the ulcer on the hip, and said the bone was carious  
6 for several inches. He even showed me the probe, which  
had on it the evidence of this condition of the bone. The  
doctor went out. Mr. Clark lay with his eyes fixed and  
9 sightless. The dew of death was on his brow. I went to  
his bedside. In a few moments his face changed; its  
death-pallor gave place to a natural hue. The eyelids  
12 closed gently and the breathing became natural; he was  
asleep. In about ten minutes he opened his eyes and  
said: "I feel like a new man. My suffering is all gone."  
15 It was between three and four o'clock in the afternoon  
when this took place.

Mind cures hip-  
disease

I told him to rise, dress himself, and take supper with  
18 his family. He did so. The next day I saw him in the  
yard. Since then I have not seen him, but am informed  
that he went to work in two weeks. The discharge from  
21 the sore stopped, and the sore was healed. The diseased  
condition had continued there ever since the injury was  
received in boyhood.

24 Since his recovery I have been informed that his physi-

27 cian claims to have cured him, and that his mother has  
been threatened with incarceration in an insane asylum  
for saying: “It was none other than God and that woman  
who healed him.” I cannot attest the truth of that  
report, but what I saw and did for that man, and what  
30 his physician said of the case, occurred just as I have  
narrated.

It has been demonstrated to me that Life is God  
194:1 and that the might of omnipotent Spirit shares not its  
strength with matter or with human will. Review-  
3 ing this brief experience, I cannot fail to discern the  
coincidence of the spiritual idea of man with the divine  
Mind.
